Steve – Builds WWII aircraft and jets. Re-started in the hobby 4 years ago.



The Tool Crib

Maketar wheel masking set. Maketar is mostly known for their national insignia and lettering painting masks, but has developed a series of 'utility' masks, also.



What differentiates Maketar from other insignia masks (like Montex) is that Maketar uses yellow 'kabuki' tape instead of vinyl. Kabuki tape has several major advantages over vinyl:

1. It doesn't shrink over time (vinyl masks are constantly shrinking and can become too small if left not used for a long time).

2. It conforms better to curved surfaces.

4. The adhesive is less "aggressive" and is less likely to leave residue behind.


The wheel mask set include about 1000 individual circular masks. Besides the wheel mask set, Maketar makes several other 'utility' sets, such as the "Canopy Survival Set", which has numerous right-angle, curved and straight sections for masking canopies, and the "Nose Cone Set", which has decreasing-radius curved strips for masking bomb stripes or aircraft nose cones. Each set includes 2 to 3 8xll sheets of die-cut elements.

The individual elements are difficult to see on the sheets. I have seen recommendations of using a wash of ink or rubbing the sheets with pencil to highlight the elements to make them easier to see. Available from Sprue Brothers or Hannants for about \$15-20 per set.


Club Demos


