

October Meeting General Meeting Notes:


Much of October's meeting was devoted to contest prep

These are hardened stainless steel tweezers used for precision work. They are used in the electronics industry for mounting surface mount devices and are actually electrostatic discharge safe! About \$11 from Amazon or eBay.

Comments:

This is my first real airbrush job. Earlier this year I decided it was time to pull this old shelf queen down, get her built, and see if I

could get a proper airbrush camo job done on her. I knew she would be a challenge and require a ton of filling, sanding and filing, so I just dug in "nose to the grindstone". The entire fuselage and the wings needed a huge amount of TLC--the "step joint" below the cockpit, the rear fuselage by the engine nacelles, and the wing leading edges all needed a healthy dose of filler. The engine nacelles themselves are very fiddly to get in just right; there is only the slightest bit of a ledge for them to attach to. I made a blanking plate for behind the air intakes, and drilled out the ventilation holes on the intakes themselves--they were just minor depressions as molded. In addition to the gravity bombs that came with the kit, I added ECM pods and AGM-78s by Hasegawa--didn't want to leave the outer racks empty on this big bad old girl! Most of the markings that came with the kit were still in good enough shape to use; I had to get tail markings from another Vietnam war era decal sheet, as the kit's tail markings fell apart. Aside from being happy with the way she turned out, I learned some

very important lessons with respect to airbrushing (getting a proper sequence set up), and canopy masking. Dedicated to my bro Wayne; this kit is part of his collection he gave me some time ago.

Another shelf queen, and a Jurassic one at that! There is so little to this kit, it could be assembled in a couple of hours if you forego rigging...but it just wouldn't look right! So I drilled out holes in the fuselage and wing struts in order to rig her up using the 1/28 Revell Spad XIII I did last year as a guide. Why do another Spad XIII in a different scale? Well, why not? I fell in love with the markings. They

are of the 17th Pursuit Squadron,
US Army Air Service based at
Selfridge Field, MI; this is a post
WWI plane. Just compare the size
and "colorfulness" of them
compared to those on the F-111A I
did. Aside from the rigging the
biggest job on this kit was sanding
off the pre-molded markings on
the wings. Another kit from my
bro's collection; slowly but surely
I'm gettin' through 'em!
