

The Tool Crib

Mike S. brought in a few sets of the new AK Weathering Pencils



Some of us have been using Prismacolor pencils for a number of years, but the AK pencils differ in being water soluble (vs. wax-based)

I can see these being useful for applying chipping and scratching, and, being watercolors, for streaking effects. Squadron carries them for about \$10 a set, or \$2.25 for individual pencils (they are 1 Euro a piece directly from AK).

Henry found some inexpensive fine-grade sandpaper at Home Depot. He brought in the 2000 and 3000 grit, which is quite useful for removing fine scratches and polishing.



At around \$5 for 10 sheets, this is a pretty good deal.

VP Jim showed his set of Mig Ammo Brass Toothpicks.



So, what, exactly, would you need a set of brass toothpicks for? Perhaps to look like a hip-hop redneck, with a bling toothpick in your mouth? Well, I have a set of these also, and they are much more robust than regular wooden toothpicks, and are very useful for creating chipping and scratching effect. They are also great for applying small amounts of superglue, because the dried superglue won't stick to the brass and you can simply break the dried superglue residue off the end of the toothpick, leaving it perfectly clean. These aren't terribly cheap (you get 3 for a retail price of \$18), but Sprue Brothers have had these on sale a couple of times as a "Deal of the Day", so if you watch for that, you can get them for considerably less (I paid \$8).

Kit Reviews

1/72 Special Hobby AJ-37/SK-37 Viggen Duo-Pack w/book



Prez Steve brought in his latest acquisition, the Special Hobby Viggen Duo-Pac in 1/72. The Viggen was an indigenously developed Swedish as a STOL fighter/attack aircraft, able to take off and land from the Swedish highway system. Reconnaissance, anti-shipping, training and electronic warfare variants were also developed. Power came from an afterburning version of the Pratt & Whitney JT8D turbofan, as used in the Boeing 727, with thrust reversing. The Viggen was replaced in the early 21st century by the Gripen, another canard delta platform.

As alluded to by the Duo-Pac name, there are 2 complete kits in the box, one to build the AJ-37 attack variant and one for the SK-37 trainer/electronic warfare version. There is also a full-color, walkaround-style book included in the package.

Steve was very impressed by the quality and detail of the kits. They obviously draw upon the research done for the Tarangus/Special Hobby 1/48th Viggen joint-venture. These new kits handily out class, in detail and accuracy, the only other 1/72 Viggen model, the elderly Heller kit.

The package retails for \$80, but it is available from Sprue Brothers for \$65, which Steve considers a bargain for 2 well done kits and a nice reference book. Recommended

This is a Diecast Cartoon 1967 VW Beetle, converted into a WWII Era Type 82e KdF Wagen - AKA. Der Käfer. I had originally gotten the - then Black - VW for my collection, but a careless cashier literally threw it (roof down!) on the counter scratching the paint to the primer! I decided to repaint it, as a

KdF wagen, and practice with it... The camouflage is a variant of the Wehrmacht/SS Hinterhalt pattern, I used a method from a 1970's article, it's not perfect, but since this would have been field applied* in this case. (*Although Hinterhalt was usually Factory Applied on most German AFVs, there were a lot of field applied variations, especially on support vehicles. The Soldaten would use everything from sprayers & stencils, to brushes & mops to apply camo, especially later in the war.) Seeing the cartoon nature of this one, I added a few 'politically incorrect' details, the markings are based loosely off of actual KdF & Kübel wagen. Decals were spares from a Tamiya Messerschmitt & Pz.II. I muddied it up a bit, even adding mud to the undercarriage! (And no one can say it's over weathered! If you've owned a VW, you know exactly what I mean!...) The driver is a slightly repainted Megablocks WWII German mini action figure, painted as a Waffen SS Staff Officer.



These guys started out as "Axis" mini action figures. The Staff Officer was repainted, and had the proper insignia added to his uniform. (Gee, he looks familiar?) The Sniper's uniform & kit was repainted & detailed based on some of my painting reference from some wargaming figures I had. The helmet is roughly based off of one I seen at auction for several thousand dollars. His

uniform represents the use of two
different patterns - a variation of
Rauchtarnmuster on the tunic, and
Erbsentarn ("Pea/Dot" pattern)
trousers. I used these guys as a
practice run for some of my more
detailed 1:35/32 scale figures

Dreamland? Eh, not quite.... Had an unusual Matchbox Diecast plane (named the "Flying Dagger"), in God awful colors & markings, and some spare YF-23 decals on hand. Decided to strip it, repaint it, and detail it. It was practice run, for a Real "Black Plane". I used Tamiya Semi-Gloss Black, with a few light coats of Testors Matte Clear Coat, using the F-117 as a reference.
