

The Tool Crib

Small Shop "Hold and Fold"



Anyone who has tried to bend photoetch knows how difficult it can be. Some are successful with tweezers, but others (like me) end up with a mangled mess. Having a purpose-made tool

for bending can go a long way to easing the frustration. Many may be familiar with Mission Models photo-etch bending tool, but this new, pocket sized tool (called "The Bug") from The Small Shop in the UK was news to me. While not useful for bending large pieces like the Mission Models tool, it would be very useful for smaller parts common to many aircraft and armor sets. It's available in the US through Sprue Brothers.

Badger Sotar 20/20 Airbrush

Curt recently sent an e-mail alerting the club member to an incredible deal Amazon had on the Badger Sotar 20/20 airbrush. I couldn't resist and bought one (I now have 8 airbrushes...). It's quite similar to my Badger Velocity Renegade (my favorite detail brush), with some differences. Here's Curt's write-up:

"It has the same nozzle as the Velocity (or visa versa since the Sotar was designed 1st), I thought the trigger was something special too, but it seems to be the same as the Badger 100 series valve plunger arrangement, the difference I see is the trigger tension spring has adjustment to it, I actually had to look at the directions as I was afraid I was disassembling the spring housing, the spring tube is segmented trapping the trigger tension spring in it, so by backing off the screw (I'll call it a drum) you will lighten the trigger pressure, I 1st started to unscrew this drum then thought I was disassembling it, and then I started to back off the entire spring body from the Airbrush body (as I would with the 100 series) but it was a very snug fit, I then resorted to the instructions and found that turning the drum does lighten the trigger.

I assume it's going to perform the same as the Velocity, and also has the one drawback of color, being black (the black only extends about half way down into the cup) it's sometimes a problem mixing the darker colors as I like to mix my paint it the cup, that's why I really would like to get the Krome, I can't wait for the day that sale comes around. Cyrus Tan was the one that suggested the design changes need to the Velocity, 1st was color then add the adjustable spring from the Sotar, so it's the best of both brushes.

Overall I would still recommend the Sotar as a very affordable upgrade that will definitely do fine work."
