



Instruction weak, show order of assembly but not efficient, mate of part OK, but needed significant trim and sanding. Open hole in deck but nothing to install there. Decals old but laid down good with Pledge wash first and Micro Sol over.

Interesting Note: Almost finished with build when shop overhead light fell, hit model and damaged aft quarterdeck. Took 1 day to find all scattered pieces and reassemble to continue



Comments:

I built & painted this old girl back in 2004 or so. A very good kit overall, but needed a good deal of sanding down of the inside wheel wells and center section of the lower wing in order to get the cockpit tub and upper fuselage to sit correctly. Not sure if it was a fault of the kit or "operator error". She represents one of the earliest versions of the perennial favorite Mustang, serving in the Tunisian conflict. Decals were a bit thick; and I built her in a time before I learned how to use Micro-Set/Sol properly. I have a few of Accurate Miniatures' other kits, including the B-25 Mitchell, and look forward to breaking them out soon!

Comments:

I broke out this kit after being inspired by Niilo's showing of the Prinz Eugen, and wanted to experiment using the same painting methods on it as I do with armor. Assembly was relatively straightforward, you just need really good magnification for all those teeny, tiny 20mm guns she has mounted! The forward 1/4 of the deck was a separate piece, so filling & sanding without destroying deck detail was a bit of a challenge. I painted the deck with Mink Tan, and gave it a wash of Burnt Sienna/Black to bring out the deck planking. I used various 10/0, 5/0, 3/0

brushes to paint the gun
mounts, superstructure, and other details
where they meet the deck (Storm Gray).
Used lightened Storm Gray for a bit of
variance/modulation, and drybrushed it on,
after a dark wash overall, to bring up the
details & highlights. She'll get the "56"
number on her sides at some point... I have
the Trumpeter kit of this same ship on my
workbench now, and plan to paint her in
the Measure 32 (Black, Ocean Blue, and
Light Gray) camo. thick; and I built her in
a time before I learned how to use MicroSet/Sol properly. I have a few of Accurate
Miniatures' other kits, including the B-25
Mitchell, and look forward to breaking
them out soon!
